

Monica is committed to life-long learning, excellence in flute playing and the development of community musicians and music appreciators. She believes that the ability to play in an ensemble is an integral part of being an accomplished musician, and has created and sustained three flute choirs -Sweet Silver, Silver Winds, and Flutter Flutes to provide players with the opportunity to achieve this goal. The three choirs range from beginner to advanced and play throughout the year for concerts, fundraisers and special events. These performances instill confidence among the flutists, and develop an important connection to the nurturing of music appreciating audiences.

A champion of outreach projects,
Monica was responsible for bringing Sweet
Silver to the 2005 International Flute
Convention for 3,000 flutists convening from
all around the world. Because of her dream,
Sweet Silver was the first flute choir in
Canada ever to be invited to perform at this
annual symposium. As well, the group
commissioned and performed four new
Manitoba compositions for flute choir which
were included in the program along with "Oh,
Canada".

Monica's passion to develop flute choirs in Winnipeg is inspired by the joy of ensemble playing and love for the music written for this unique combination of instruments. She varies the musical selections to suit the seasons and showcase the diversity among people. Her emphasis is on learning and growing together, trying new things and encouraging each person to achieve greatness to their highest level. This inspires performers to relate to one another in a

positive manner, share ideas, and claim their skill and ability as artists.

Monica encourages her private flute students of all ages to take part in workshops and masterclasses, to learn from many, and to discover their own voice. She is a seasoned coach, having prepared many students for RCM Exams, music competitions and university auditions. She is responsible for bringing in international flutists to teach and perform, and was a founder of the Winnipeg Flute Fest. Monica is fluent in French, holds a B.A. of Arts from the University of Winnipeg and studied music at the University of Manitoba. Her primary teachers include Laurel Ridd from Winnipeg and Patricia Spencer from New York.

Twila is originally from Edmonton, Canada where she attended the University of Alberta for her Bachelor's degree with a double major in History and Music. In 2011, she completed her Masters in Musicology at the University of Victoria (Canada). Her Master's thesis, 'Two Responses to Modernism: Minimalism and New Complexity in Solo Flute Repertoire', explored select examples of flute repertoire composed between 1975-1996, demonstrating similarities between two seemingly divergent genres of twentiethcentury music in their response to Modernism. Twila's doctoral research at Bangor University (UK) focuses on the American composer, Steve Reich's counterpoint works. She is a recipient of Bangor University's 125 Anniversary Research Scholarship, and has presented her research throughout North America and Europe. CHRISTINE ERLANDER BEARD



Described by critics as "masterful" and "evocative," flutist Christine Erlander Beard is constantly in demand as a soloist, chamber artist, and clinician. Quickly achieving international recognition as a performer and advocate for the piccolo, she has performed extensively across the United States, South America and Europe, including ten conventions of the National Flute Association, the European Piccolo Festival in Slovenia, the International Flute Festival of Costa Rica, the International Flute Festival in France, the World Flutes Festival in Argentina, and two British Flute Society Conventions. The Roy Seaman Piccolo Artist for the Gemeinhardt Flute Co., she is the Executive Director of the International Piccolo Symposium (www.piccolosymposium.com/), the first festival in North America to focus exclusively on the performance practice and study of solo repertoire and orchestral excerpts for the piccolo. A contributing editor for NFA's magazine, The Flutist Quarterly, her pedagogical articles and columns have been published in Flute Talk, The Flutist Ouarterly, Flutewise (UK), and The Instrumentalist, and she is also the founder of the acclaimed website "Piccolo Headquarters" (www.piccolohq.com/). Dr. Beard earned her MM and DMA in flute performance from The University of Texas at Austin. She joined the faculty at the University of Nebraska at Omaha in 2002 where she teaches applied flute, chamber music, and serves as Coordinator of Woodwind Studies. (www.christiebeard.com)

JEAN-LOUIS BEAUMADIER



Jean-Louis Beaumadier studied flute with Joseph Rampal at the Marseille Conservatory and continued his studies at the National Superior Conservatory in Paris under the stimulating teaching of Jean-Pierre Rampal. Following his studies, he performed as piccolo soloist with the National Orchestra of France for twelve years, during which time he performed under the batons of such renowned conductors as Sergiù Celibidache, Leonard Bernstein, Lorin Maazel, Seiji Ozawa, Karl Böhm, Pierre Boulez and others.

Beaumadier has appeared as guest soloist with the Orchestre National de France, Orchestre Jean-François Paillard, Orchestre d'Auvergne, Orchestre de Chambre de Tours, Orchestre des Jeunes du Venezuela in Caracas, Brussel Chamber Orchestra, Wiener Concert Verein, New-York Soloists, Orchestre de Cannes, Orchestre de Picardie, "Ensemble orchestral de Marseille, Ensemble "La Follia" de Mulhouse, Le "Concert Buffardin ", "Les Musiciens de France ", Orchestre de Bohème and others.

Much in demand as a piccolo soloist, Beaumadier performs in Ireland, Israel, England, Japan, the United States, Belgium, Germany, Senegal, Croatia, Spain, Austria, Brazil, Venezuela, Costa Rica and Italy as well as over one thousand concerts throughout France. He also performs frequently as soloist on radio and television.


Beaumadier has recorded twenty CDs, including International Grand Prize Winner of the Charles Cros Academy for his disc, "The Golden Age of Piccolo" featuring works of Eugène Damare (1840-1919) (Calliope

Records 9869 Harmonia-Mundi) concerning this recording, Aurèle Nicolet has written, "Beaumadier's record is marvelous in sound, in technique, and above all in elegance and charm. It is a true delight!"

Regardless of musical demands or genre, Beaumadier takes the piccolo to greater and greater heights and has establishes himself as an artist beyond compare. Jean-Pierre Rampal wrote about Beaumadier: "Endowed with marvelous technique, he stands out, thanks to his winning, personality and his developed artistry. It is a pleasure to listen to him sometimes dreaming and others vibrating..."

WILLIAM BENNETT



One of the foremost musical artists performing today, William Bennett has raised the profile of the flute to that of an instrument capable of a wide range of tonal colours, dynamics, and expression, giving it the depth, dignity, and grandeur of the voice or a string instrument.

He studied in London with Geoffrey Gilbert, and in France with Jean-Pierre Rampal and Marcel Moyse.

The Master classes of Marcel Moyse in Switzerland in the late 70's provided extra stimulus and inspiration so that William Bennett's burgeoning career developed as an International soloist and recording artist.

He has enjoyed long lasting musical partnerships with harpsichordist George Malcolm and pianist Clifford Benson, with whom he has extensively recorded, and his solo recordings with Yehudi Menuhin, the Grumiaux Trio, I Musici, the Academy of St. Martin in the Fields, and the English

Chamber Orchestra have received international acclaim and enthusiastic reviews in record and CD journals.

Early in his career he made the first English recording of the complete Handel Flute Sonatas, and of contemporary works including the Sonatine of Boulez, Berio's Sequenza, Messaien's Merle Noir, and Richard Rodney Bennett's "Winter Music" specially written for him.

In addition to recording the standard flute repertoire of Bach, Handel, Vivaldi, Mozart, etc., he has made pioneer recordings of many neglected 19th century works, such as music by Ries, Romberg, and Taffanel. He has recorded with artists such as Jimi Hendrix and Wynton Marsalis. He has made over 100 CD's as a soloist. He premiered the Concerto by William Mathias, the Concerto by Diana Burrell and the Concerto for Flute and Orchestra by Venezuelan composer Raymund Pineda. All of these were specially written for him.

He has been principal flute in many orchestras including the London Symphony, the Academy of St Martin in the Fields, and the English Chamber Orchestra.

He has been Professor of Flute in the Freiburg Hochschule of Music in Germany, and he teaches at the Royal Academy of Music in London. He teaches Masterclasses all over the world.

In addition to making a Balalaika and a Guitar whilst at school, he has made and improved Flutes from an early age and has done a lot of work on improving and refining the tuning of the flute, and several makers in the world now make flute on the "William Bennett Scale".

This year his Concert and Masterclass engagements take him to Holland, U.S.A Singapore, Canada, Lithuania, Belgium, Japan, China/Taiwan etc. and he is going to record several contemporary Flute pieces.

In 2002 he was awarded the National Flute Association's "Lifetime Achievement Award" and in 2003 he was appointed the British Flute Society's "Flautist Laureate". In 2004 he was awarded the title of "Flute of Gold" from the Italian "Falaut" Flute society. In 2009 he was awarded the "Lifetime Achievement Award" by the Chicago Flute Club.

In January 1995 H.M. The Queen presented William Bennett with the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (O.B.E) for his distinguished Services to Music.
